Neighbourhood Watch Program

- Constable Duhme and Peter Weston explained how to set up a neighbourhood watch and shared many crime prevention ideas for home owners. For more information, visit the Ottawa Police web site at www.ottawapolice.ca. Peter's presentation is also available at cardinalcreek.org.

Graffiti Program

- Constable Walter Duhme gave an overview of the Orleans Graffiti pilot program which took place in 2005 and 2006 and was very successful in decreasing the amount of graffiti found in our community.
- He explained what is graffiti, what motives young people to do it and how parents can be more aware of signs that usually exist within the home to indicate that a youth is involved in graffiti.
- Councillor Bob Monette has been personally involved in the graffiti program and fully supports it. Councillor Monette's assistant indicated that a graffiti wall is being built in Orleans next to the skateboard park to give kids a place to focus their artistic talents. This approach has been successful in other cities.
- Residents should report graffiti to the utilities companies or the City of Ottawa as soon as possible. Call 311 to report graffiti. It is usually cleaned up within a week or two, depending on the weather and access to the site in question.

Fire Prevention

- Yvan Tanner gave a very informative session on fire prevention in the home.
- Tip: smoke alarms should be vacuumed once a year and replaced every ten years
- Tip: residents should always test the battery in their fire alarms when they return from an extended absence of 2 weeks or more. The battery may have died out and although it emits a signal when it is weak, the resident may have missed it during his/her absence
